More commonly called an ASEV, the inspection is conducted every two years to assess the Group's flyers and Standardization and Evaluation programs.

Evaluation inspection that ended in May.

"They looked at how we evaluate the crews' reviews and certifications," said Lt. Col. Ken Harris, 931st Stan/Eval Chief. "They also reviewed how our training programs prepare crews."

The inspections began in March with flight evaluations and flyers were tested on general knowledge during the last week of April. The evaluation ended on Saturday of the May Unit Training Assembly with the crewmembers completing a written test.

The ASEV team divided their assessment into four areas. The final results released during the out briefing showed all areas rated as "Satisfactory."

"Essentially, you're either mission ready or you're not mission ready, and we are mission ready," said Lt. Col. Harris.

New commander nominated

Maj. Gen. John A. Bradley has been nominated by the president to the Senate for promotion to lieutenant general and appointment as chief of Air Force Reserve and commander of Air Force Reserve Command.

Lt. Gen. James E. Sherrard III, chief of Air Force Reserve and AFRC commander, relinquished command of AFRC during a ceremony May 11. Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. John P. Jumper presided over General Sherrard's retirement, which took effect June 1.

If General Bradley is not confirmed by June 1, Maj. Gen. John J. Batbie Jr., AFRC vice commander, will

continue to lead the command until General Bradley is confirmed.

General Bradley has been the assistant to the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff for Reserve Matters in the Pentagon since December 2002.

General Bradley began his Air Force career in September 1967 as a mathematician and program analyst at Headquarters Strategic Air Command, Offutt Air Force Base, Neb.

He completed Undergraduate Pilot Training at Sheppard AFB, Texas, in March 1970, and separated from the active force in April 1973 to join the Air Force Reserve at Barksdale AFB, La



Travel cardholders have online-payment option

Airmen with government travel cards can now make payments to their accounts online.

The "MyEasyPayment" system allows Airmen with government travel cards to pay off residual or unexpected charges not covered by split disbursement payments, said Josephine Davis, the Air Force banking liaison officer.

"Split disbursement of travel card payments is mandatory for military members and civilians, but there are unavoidable situations when the split-disbursed amount does not cover your total charges," Ms. Davis said.

When Airmen return from travel, they file a voucher so they can be reimbursed for their expenses. That payment, or disbursement, is split between the Airmen's personal-checking account and their travel-card account. Airmen are responsible for indicating how much money should be sent to the travel-card account. If there is a miscalculation of the amount owed on the travel card, there can be residual or unexpected charges still owed.

An example of an unexpected or residual charge is when an Airman makes a purchase overseas and the ex-

change rate changes before the merchant processes the charge, Ms. Davis said. Another example is when Airmen lose receipts and forget about charges on their cards.

Despite those types of errors, Ms. Davis said Airmen are still responsible for paying off their accounts.

"Just like with any other credit card, it is our responsibility to know what we owe," Ms. Davis said. "Sometimes you need to call the bank and find out what you need to pay. This system gives you the opportunity to make those payments."

Airmen with questions about being reimbursed for unexpected or residual charges on their accounts should contact their military travel pay office, Ms. Davis said. Travelers may need to file an amended travel voucher if they feel they are owed money.


The payment system is available at **www.myeasypayment.com.** To use the system, cardholders need to know the amount they want to pay on the card, the card's account number and security code, and their checking account and bank routing numbers.

Ms. Davis said cardholders can check their account balance by calling the toll-free number on the back of the card.

Air Force members are being urged not to allow individuals or companies to photocopy their credit cards, as well military and other forms of identification.

The Air Force has recently received complaints of such activities taking place at car rental agencies. Photocopies could not only be used for identity theft, but also are considered a threat to security.

Phone card donation program goes public

The selling of prepaid calling cards by the Army and Air Force Exchange Service to any person or organization that wishes to purchase cards for deployed servicemembers has been authorized by Defense officials. The "Help Our Troops Call Home" program is designed to assist servicemembers calling home from Southwest Asia.

To donate a prepaid calling card to a servicemember people can log on to the exchange Web site at **www.aafes.com** and click the 'Help Our Troops Call Home' link. Cards never expire and there are no added charges or connection fees.

TSP open through June

The current Thrift Savings Plan open season runs until June 30. This is the time servicemembers can start or change contributions to their account. Up to nine percent of base pay can be contributed each month and up to 100 percent of incentive and special pay, including bonus and combat pay, can be contributed. Total contributions from taxable pay may not exceed the Internal Revenue Service limit of \$13,000 for 2004. Enrollment can be done online at






